If you choose not to apply to ITE through ITE EAE, you may still do so through other admissions exercises, such as the Joint Intake Exercise (JIE) or Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE).

ITE EAE is open to:

- Students who are Singapore Citizens/Singapore Permanent Residents and registered to sit for N- or O-Levels in 2017;
- International Students currently in Government, Government-aided or Independent Schools who are registered to sit for N- or O-Level in 2017; and
- Singapore Citizens/Singapore Permanent Residents who have taken the GCE N- or O-Level examinations previously.

Your conditional offer will be automatically confirmed if you meet subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs) for the course. If your ITE EAE offer is confirmed, you will not be eligible to participate in the upcoming JIE or JAE.
